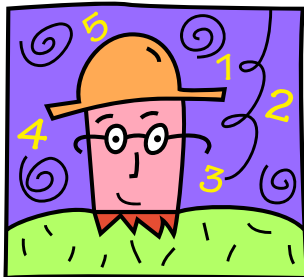

February Home To-Do List: Warm Up, Clean Up

Give your sweetie a Valentine's Day present by catching up on some deferred cleaning and maintenance with these 7 easy tips.

1. Dust Off:

Get the dust out from under and behind the refrigerator and the stove.

2. Swap Filters:

Change the furnace filter.

3. Clean Carpets:

Pretreat stains then shampoo the carpets. Take two passes over high-traffic areas.

4. Tune-up Your Vacuum:

Change a bagless vacuum's air filter, clear its air flow channels and wash out its canister.

5. Clean Vents:

Clean the range hood vent and filter.

6. Peel It Off:

To kill mildew, peel the bath mat from the tub, turn it upside down, pour some bleach into the tub and run some water. If there's mildew on the shower curtain liner, put it in the tub as well.

7. Tackle Small Repairs:

Insulate the water heater and the hot-water pipe leaving it. Install door stops to prevent doorknob damage to drywall.

Curb Appeal: First Impressions Count

According to those in the know, it's the number one factor in beginning the sales process for houses as well as condominiums. It's simple. The appeal of your home from the street is what lures people to the door and inside.

All the upgrades that people do to the inside of their home won't matter if you can't get buyers inside. A boring facade requires some sales pitch from the agent. Curb appeal makes the agent's job easier.

Here are Factors Important to Curb Appeal:

- Check the condition of the roof; fix it if necessary.
- Make sure windows are painted and well maintained.
- Repair cracks in the sidewalk and driveway.

- Fix faulty handrails.
- Improve lighting for the address number or highlight your front walkway with lights.
- Ensure the address number is easy to read.
- Get a new doormat.
- Paint or clean the garage doors.
- Paint the front door an attractive color.
- Put urns or planters on either side of the door (in winter, use evergreens).
- Get rid of visible storage, recycling boxes or other junk visible from the road.
- Throw in some attractive landscaping and the house is transformed.

ROSE PETAL POUND CAKE

- 1 cup butter, softened
- 1-2/3 cups white sugar
- 5 eggs
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon almond extract
- 1-1/2 ounces finely chopped almonds
- 1 teaspoon rosewater
- 2 drops red food coloring



1. Preheat oven to 350° F (175° C). Grease one 9 inch tube pan.
2. Cream butter well. In a separate bowl beat sugar and eggs together until doubled in volume. Add sifted flour and salt gradually. Fold in creamed butter thoroughly.
3. Divide batter into two equal parts. Into one part add the almond extract and the ground almonds. To the other part add the rosewater and the red food coloring. Spoon batters alternately into the prepared pan.
4. Bake at 350° F (175° C) for 50 to 60 minutes. Let cake cool then remove from pan and dust with confectioner's sugar.
